Class Descriptions: (both classes will be offered each day)

Joy's 'Dyeing 101' class includes a brief tour on the basics of colour,

wool and dyes before participants dip in to the exciting world of dyeing their own special pieces of wool. The class includes a Dye Journal where you will find comprehensive notes and lots of pages to record your own colour recipes.

The **'Dyeing on Purpose'** class will skip the basics

and get straight into discovering methods to produce just the right piece of dyed wool for your particular needs. The Dye Journal is also included.



Small pots of Landscape Dyes, a limited supply of dye spoons, as well as new and found wool fabric will be available for purchase. If you prefer you can bring your own supplies.
