RECIPE

I often make this for morning tea on Rug days, and use mulberries, as I have a large tree. I use them fresh or frozen. (thawed)

Danish Applecake.

Ingredients
30 grams (3oz) butter
30 grams (3oz) Sugar
30grams (3oz) Self raising flour
1 egg

Cream butter and sugar, add egg and flour press 2/3rd of the mixture on a flattish dinner plate size cooking dish. Add lots of fruit,. say 3 granny smith apples sliced, or 2 large cups chopped rhubarb, or plums, peaches, berries

whatever you have. Place the rest of the mixture in dobs on the top. Cook at 170C for 25 minutes, Sprinkle to with sugar, cook further 15 minutes. If the fruit is very juicy, maybe a few minutes more, serve warm, with whipped cream.

Before the rug was started I chose my background colour red as I had a lot of red material then decided to hook bright colours on the accents and shapes. I used new and recycled hand dyed and 'as is' wool. The recycled wool is sweaters, blankets and skirts.

. Someone who came once to The Sunshine Coast Rug Crafters group does a lot of embroidery/tapestry and uses these to make a lap frame. Website www.sewtail.com.au

They're called "Grip'n frame", and can be bought online from www.sewitall.com.au for about \$30 for one pack of 10x50cm (= 5 meters), or two packs for \$54. The angle strip I bought in the hardware store. I cut all to size and screwed it onto the frame. The grippers just slide onto the angle strip and can be removed easily. It works a treat stretching the rug in process and doesn't pull any strips out. Several people can share a pack, so it is quite economical





WARNING. Be wary of opening emails from friends if you think they look a little different. Delete and then email the person and ask if they sent it. FOLLOWING UP ON LABELLING YOUR WORK

I was told of a fusible webbing, one brand called 'Vliesofix' from Craft stores. This can be ironed onto the back of a piece of fabric on which you have written your story, then remove paper backing and iron on to the back of the rug.

Joy is also an artist who paints the most beautiful water colours, as well as making beautiful rugs; designing and


dyeing all her own wool for


every project and working with wool felt. At the moment Joy is working on a set of staircase tread rugs based on Psalm 23; 'The Lord is my Shepherd'.
