I used a few embellishments and painted her face on wool with a Japanese ink and heat set it. I used some metallic thread in her crown and buttons on her blouse and skirt. Faux shirring is where you take strips of wool and sew them onto the foundation in the middle of the strip. The next strip is attached close to the first strip and sewed in the middle. This method is filling the large area of red on her skirt. I needed a project to teach at camp so I decided to develop Nivens McTwisp, the rabbit from "Alice and Wonderland". He has needle felted ears and tail and I found charms for the watch around the belt. The duo was just joined by a jester cat. I put the cat on an antique leg turned upside down. I love making stuffed projects and I now I have something to fill my mantel.
